





The Aftermath of the 2023 Turkey-Syria Earthquake

It was a cold February morning in Central Turkey when everyone there faced a seismic challenge on February 6, 2023. A formidable 7.8-magnitude earthquake struck near the northern border of Syria, shaking the very foundations of Central Turkey. The repercussions were profound, resulting in staggering losses of nearly 2000 lives and widespread structural collapse as the tremors rippled across the region.

Scientific reason

According to scientific research, two tectonic plates rubbed against each other about 12 miles south of Turkey and north of Syria. The movement caused both static and dynamic stress, leading to the release of energy in the form of an earthquake. This unexpected physics behind the earthquake highlights the complex interplay of geological forces that contributed to this seismic.

The Impact


